### **COACHES**

**Tony Bustos** is the coach for the varsity girls' basketball team. He teaches Algebra II Pre-AP. During his eight years at Woodrow, he has

also coached varsity football and boys' JV basketball. Altogether, Coach Bustos has coached for 22 years, including 10 years with varsity football in El Paso, and four years as the head football coach at North Dallas High School. Coach Bustos led this year's Lady Wildcats to a 16-14 record, making it to the playoffs in a highly competitive season. He stresses that of the 14 losses, 10 were to teams that made the playoffs. "I scheduled us against those strong teams in order to toughen us up," says Bustos. He attributes the success to a good mix of veteran players and newcomers. "We really bonded as a team, and everyone worked well and hard together." He is looking forward to next season. "We have three starters returning, and it's also time for the next wave of great players to step up."

**Patrick Washington** is the varsity coach for boys' basketball at Woodrow. He also teaches Business Computer Information Systems (BCIS). When he first came to

Woodrow five years ago, Coach Washington was an ISS instructor. Before that, he taught at Seagoville, Roosevelt, and A. Maceo Smith High Schools. His career also includes a stint as a financial administrator at Howard University and playing professional basketball in Sweden. His college alma mater is Florida Memorial --- in XXX, Florida. Looking back on the past season, Coach Washington is proud of the 14-14 record, and making the play-offs for the second time in five years. "We may not be a basketball powerhouse, but I think we're headed in that direction," he says. As for the coming season, he says, "We have two returning starters and several other very strong players. Next year looks pretty decent!"
